Jean-Baptiste Demaison is **Chair of the Management Board and Executive Board of the European Network and Information Security Agency (ENISA)** since 18 October 2016. M. Demaison is as well **Senior Advisor to the Strategy Director at the French Cybersecurity Agency** (ANSSI), which he joined in 2011, and is in charge of coordinating ANSSI's strategic and policy orientations on the security of the Digital Transformation. He chaired the EU Cooperation Group work responsible for the elaboration of the « Reference document on security measures for operators of essential operators », adopted in 2017. He is today co-chair of the OECD expert group on critical infrastructure protection.

**Experienced in cyber operational and crisis management**, M. Demaison participated to the two-year evaluation of CERT of the Union institutions, agencies and bodies (CERT-EU). He also contributed to the elaboration of EU Standard Operating Procedures, the definition of the CSIRT network terms of reference and to several CyberEurope exercises.

Previously, Mr. Demaison worked for the Strategic-Research Institute of the French Military Academy (IRSEM) and for the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs, as Deputy Director and International Relations lecturer within the French department of the Faculty of Political Science and Economics of the Cairo University.
