

Eva Spina is Director General at the Ministry of Economic Development since February 2014. She deals with frequency coordination at the national and international level and manages the national frequency register. She guides international activities affecting Italian use of the spectrum with a particular focus on spectrum policy relative to multilateral organizations, including the International Telecommunication Union (ITU), the European Conference of Postal and Telecommunications (CEPT,) and the Radio Spectrum Policy Group (RSPG) in the European Union. She is the ITU national Focal point since April 2015 and she was the ITU Council's Chair in 2017.

In 2019 she was also Director of the High Institute of Communications and Information Technologies – ISCTI – Directorate General of the Italian Ministry of Economic Development and, consequently, the Responsible of the National CERT (Computer Emergency Response Team), Director of the Cyber Security Certification Body for commercial products and systems operating within the Common Criteria Recognition Arrangement – CCRA – and Senior Official Group for Information Systems Security – SOGIS – MRA.

She is the Italian representative at the ENISA Management Board, the European Union Agency for Network and Information Security.

Currently, she is Director of Communication Technologies and Cybersecurity Directorate of the Italian Ministry of Economic Development, dealing with - from a technical point of view - the national law on Golden Power for 5G (according to which all contracts or agreements concerning the acquisition of goods or services related to the design, construction, maintenance and management of the 5G networks or the acquisition of highly technological network components have to be notified to Presidency of Council of Ministers, in case the above contracts or agreements are set up with parties outside the European Union). She is working on the implementation of the Perimeter cybersecurity national law and the Cybersecurity Act. She is also the Director of the "High Specialization School on Telecommunications" established within ISCTI since 1923 and the Responsible of the Certification Body for network systems and terminal equipments operating in TETRA technology (TErrestrial Trunked RAdio).

She has earned the qualification of Senior Civil Servant in 1999 – 2001 in Italian National School of Government (SSPA) and graduated cum laude from Bari University, with a degree in law.
