NLOs – how it all started

The network was 'born' in a MB meeting discussion back in 2004:

'Board Members, or their alternates, or other officials appointed by the Board Member, could act as a liaison officer for ENISA within his/her own Country. The Liaison Officer would be a "facilitator" for ENISA activities within his/her Country'

Composition of NLO network

The NLO network consists of (at least) one NLO per member state: 35 members

- 30 from EU MS, (AT, ES, CY \rightarrow nominated two NLOs)
- 3 from each EEA,
- 1 from European Council and
- 1 from EC

We have 11 members who are both NLO and MB members (or alternates)
