

Privacy statement – ENISA conference ‘AI an Opportunity for EU cyber crisis management’

All personal data shall be processed in accordance with the Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data.¹

The data controller of the processing operation is ENISA Core Operations Department.

The legal basis for the processing operation is Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725² based on article 3(b)(v) of the Regulation (EU) No 526/2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 21 May 2013, repealing Regulation (EC) No 460/2004 (see: [link](#)).

The purpose of this processing operation is to organise participants’ management including speakers, panellists and audience, for the conference.

The following personal data are collected: Name, surname, affiliation, country, telephone number and e-mail address.

The recipients of the data will be the designated ENISA staff involved in the planning of the conference, as well as EU bodies charged with monitoring or inspection tasks in application of EU law (e.g. internal audits, European Anti-fraud Office – OLAF).

Personal data will be kept up to a maximum period of three months after the conference. The retention of the data is needed to provide anonymised statistics for the drafting of the proceedings of the conference.

You have the right to access your personal data, the right to correct any inaccurate or incomplete personal data and the right to delete your data.
