





Problems create Problems create Problems ...



- Poor Network Reputation
- Blacklisting issues
- Unsatisfied Customers → Increased Churn
- Wasting up sale Potentials
- "Supporting" illegal activities → political awareness → political pressure
- Good employees are rare and expensive
- Initial development takes long and is expensive
- Staying up to date is expensive (summits, software development, ...)
- Incoming mass of reports seems to huge

We are not talking about it, we are doing it!

- ARF has become a RFC Standard (RFC 5965)

 - Schemas for reporting login attacks, fraud phishing, malware

- RIR news: Making abuse contacts mandatory in WHOIS
 - APNIC introduced the mandatory IRT Object in November :-)
 - AfriNIC is starting a Last Call for Proposal
 - RIPE is talking and moving forward
