

PRIVACY STATEMENT – ECSM MEETINGS

PRIVACY STATEMENT

Your personal data shall be processed in accordance with the Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data¹.

The data controller and data processor of the processing operation is the European Union Agency for Cybersecurity (ENISA).

The legal basis for the processing of data is Article 5(1) (a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725.

The purpose of the processing of personal data is to register interested person to Ad Hoc Working Group on Common Criteria meetings, provide access to the meeting venue, maintain the participants' list, as well as allow the follow up of the meeting.

The following personal data are collected (upon registration to the event): title, full name, country, organisation, position held, email address.

The recipients of your data will be: designated ENISA staff dealing with ECSM matters.

The final participants list (name, surname, organisation, country) will be kept for a maximum period of 5 years after the end of the meeting for auditing purposes.

Your contact data will be kept for a maximum period of six months after the end of the meeting for communication/follow-up of the meeting.

Data will be deleted at the end of the aforementioned periods.

You have the right to access your personal data and the right to correct any inaccurate or incomplete personal data. If you have any queries concerning the processing of your personal data, you may address them to ecsm@enisa.europa.eu.
