Preliminary Agenda

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1 Context

Reliable communications networks and services are now critical to public welfare and economic stability. Recent attacks on Internet resources and services in Member States revealed the increased vulnerabilities of our Information Society. The experience has revealed that any country or service provider, acting independently, may face difficulties in effectively preventing and responding to this type of attacks which often originate from beyond national and European borders.

Recent Commission Communications¹ highlighted the importance of network and information security for the creation of a single European information space and stressed the importance of dialogue, partnership and empowerment of all stakeholders. The proposed update of the existing Regulatory Framework includes certain measures for the improvement of the security and resilience of public e-Communication Networks.

The European Network and Information Security Agency (ENISA), fully recognising this problem, devised a Multi-annual Thematic Program (MTP) on the security and resilience of public e-Communication networks and services in Europe². The ultimate objective is to collectively evaluate and improve the security and resilience of these networks and services in Europe.

The Agency will reach this goal by analysing how national authorities implement current regulatory measures, assessing how network and service providers of public Communication Networks ensure availability and integrity of their networks and services, and by evaluating whether existing technologies satisfy the needs and requirements of these providers. The stock taking will help the Agency to identify gaps, inconsistencies, but also best practices.

In 2009 the results of the analysis will be compared against trends, recommendations and guidelines proposed by other national, European and global initiatives. Based on an extensive consultation with relevant stakeholders the Agency will then propose guidelines that might contribute to the development of a common regulatory framework for electronic communications in Europe.

2 Scope and format of the Workshop

With this first consultation workshop ENISA is trying to bring together all relevant stakeholders to debate about European policy on preventive, detection, emergency and recovery measures and technologies related to resilience of electronic communications. The result of this workshop will help the agency to scope down its efforts and prioritise on the topics that mostly affect resilience of public communication networks.

The workshop will debate, among others, about business continuity plans, pre-arranged priority restoration, testing of multi-domain networks, critical communications paths and priority communications, protection measures on DNS, traffic and exchange routing, security in BGP, detection of attacks.

The workshop is organised around two thematic areas each corresponding to a breakout session. The themes are 1) regulatory measures, 2) operational security measures deployed by providers and technologies and standards. Each breakout session is organised as open, brainstorming session where participants debate about the topics and the approach that ENISA should take to perform the stock taking exercise. The outcome of each session will be presented in plenary to all participants with the objective to develop a consolidated approach.

3 Profile of Participants

The workshop is open to experts representing stakeholders from national regulatory authorities, national authorities responsible for the definition and implementation of security measures, legal experts on security regulations, providers of public electronic communication networks and services, associations of providers, professional IT security companies, software and hardware vendors of network equipments, research organisations/ universities and standardisation bodies.
