Examples: nationally based identities

- Access to governmental services:
 - Tax, Social benefits,
- Banking: Anti money laundering
 - Know your customer
- Property transfer
 - Land registry
- Car hire
 - Licence to drive
 - Pay speeding finds



Examples: private identity

- Age restricted web site
- Payments
- Shopping loyalty card
- Health
 - Insurance
 - Authorising Access to health records



National Identity: Requirements

- Strong registration checks on identity
- Independent proof that identified person has sole control over authentication means



Private Identity Requirements

Minimise data released
(see DIS 23220-1 clause 5.2):

- Partial attribute release
 - Only release necessary attributes to relying party
- Unlinked transactions
 - Only link cryptographic protection to relevant activities
- Pseudonym
 - Domain specific identifier



User consent and choice !!!

EU Digital Identity Wallet

- Aimed at public and private sector
- Supports attestation of attributes
- ‘Use of pseudonyms in electronic transactions shall not be prohibited.’
- ‘The user shall be in full control of the European Digital Identity Wallet’
- Supports multiple identities (?)
