


CEF - Building Blocks

The **Connecting Europe Facility (CEF)** Digital programme has been the EU's largest financing instrument for trans-European digital infrastructure from **2014-2021**. It has supported the adoption and reuse of digital Building Blocks in public and private projects, and services on a continental scale. **Building Blocks** are standards-based open and reusable digital solutions that enable basic capabilities, such as trusted authentication, secure data exchange or data preservation






Reuse of the elDAS building blocks







There is a growing interest from 3rd countries such as Japan, Ukraine etc.



Article 14 of elDAS


"Trust services provided by trust service providers established in a third country shall be recognised as legally equivalent to qualified trust services provided by qualified trust service providers established in the Union where the trust services originating from the third country are recognised under an agreement concluded between the Union and the third country in question or an international organisation in accordance with Article 218 TFEU"
