






ENISA work on the DSM and NIS Industry



- Towards a Digital Single Market for NIS Products and Services (2016)
 - demand-side and supply-side analysis for an understanding of the current and evolving market of NIS products and services and identifying opportunities and threats for EU NIS suppliers
- Effective models for start-ups in NIS (on-going)
 - analysis of the technical innovation and funding aspects of the EU cybersecurity start-up ecosystem and identification of opportunities for and obstacles against start-up growth within the EU market

Objectives of the study




- understanding the start-up landscape from a technological and market perspective and determining what is currently established in the EU related to NIS products and services;
- gaining insight into the investment and funding channels available for NIS start-ups from both the public and private sector;
- building knowledge of the opportunities for growth of the EU NIS start-up market within the context of current EU policy frameworks, at all stages of evolution for start-ups; and
- proposing recommendations towards EU
 policy makers, member states policy makers
 and the NIS start-up ecosystem to leverage
 existing opportunities and lower obstacles for
 NIS start-ups creation and growth in the EU.
