

EU CyberNet – EU cyber capacity building network

- Strengthen the global delivery, coordination and coherence of the EU's external cyber capacitybuilding projects
- 2. Reinforce EU's capacity to provide technical assistance to partner countries in the areas of cybersecurity and countering cybercrime

- 1. Build **EU expert community** for external cyber capacity-building (CCB)
- 2. Provide CCB **expertise and training service** for partners
- 3. Gather and share CCB information and knowledge
- 4. Establish a regional cyber competence centre (LAC4)
- 5. Provide **support to the Commission services** (expertise on external cyber actions)






